NOTICE TO CONTRIBUTORS

The *Israel Journal of Earth Sciences* welcomes original research articles in all fields of the earth sciences, with particular reference to the geology of Israel, the Near East, and the Eastern Mediterranean region.

In addition, from time to time, special issues will be published devoted to active fields of research of current interest.

If accepted, papers become the property of the publisher, Laser Pages Publishing Ltd., and may not be published elsewhere in full or in part without permission.

All papers are subject to peer review. Authors are invited to suggest competent referees for consideration by the editorial board. Referees will remain anonymous unless they expressly request to be identified.

Submissions should be typed double-spaced on one side of the paper only, with margins of at least 2.5 cm. All pages should be consecutively numbered.

To expedite publication of manuscripts, authors should submit the final accepted version in electronic format, including the text, tables, and figures. Figures, even if included in the running text file, should also be submitted as separate files whenever possible, in JPEG, TIFF, EPS or PICT format (in that order of preference). Diskette, Zip, or CD-ROM are acceptable. The name and version of the word processor used, as well as programs used to prepare figures, should be indicated.

Include written permission from the publisher to reproduce any previously published tables or figures (even if you are the author).

Please follow these guidelines in preparing the paper for publication:

Title page

This should include:

- (1) A brief and informative title.
- (2) Full names, affiliations, and addresses (including postal code) of all authors. The first author will receive all correspondence, including proofs, unless otherwise indicated. Indicate telephone and fax numbers and e-mail address of the corresponding author.
- (3) Suggested running head (short title for journal page identification)—maximum six words.

Abstract

State concisely the scope of the study, significant results, and main conclusions—maximum of 250 words.

Text

Indicate headings and subheadings clearly. Indent paragraphs. Figures, tables, and plates must be referred to in the text, and will be placed as close as possible to their first mention. Words in italics should appear in italics in the hard copy, or be underlined. Avoid footnotes.

For correct spelling of place names in Israel and the Sinai, refer to *Israel—Touring Map 1:250,000 and List of Settlements, Antiquity Sites and Road Distances*, Survey of Israel, 1992.

References within the text should indicate names(s) of the author(s) and year of publication for one or two authors; use “et al.” for more than two authors (but in the Reference section list *all* authors). Use letters to distinguish among citations with the same author(s) and year. Multiple references in the text should be arranged chronologically; those of the same year alphabetically. Examples: (Jones, 1980a,b, 1988; Cohen and Jones, 1987; Levy et al., 1989; Xavier, 1989; Brown, in press). “In press” is acceptable; “in preparation” is equivalent to “unpublished” and should not appear in the references. Unpublished material, if not available to the general public, should be referred to as “personal communication”, followed by the author, affiliation, and year; the author is responsible for obtaining permission for such citation from the person cited.

Tables

Tables should be planned so as to fit single or double column width. Number tables consecutively with Arabic numerals in order of appearance in the text. Present each table double-spaced on a separate page, with a short descriptive caption directly above the table and any footnotes (indicated by superscript lower case italic letters) directly below the table.

Figures

Number all figures with Arabic numerals in order of appearance in the text. Type all legends double-spaced consecutively on a separate sheet. Identify all figures on the back in pencil with the authors' names and figure number, indicating TOP. Plan figures to fit the proportions of the printed page. Figures should be in a form suitable for reproduction. Lettering should be large enough (10–12 points) to take a reduction of 50 to 60%. Symbols used to identify points within a graph should be large enough that they will be easily distinguishable after reduction.

LINE DRAWINGS. Submit good reproductions initially; when notified of acceptance, send reproduction-quality originals, as well as computer files whenever possible. Plan illustrations for column (7.6 cm) or full page (15.8) width. Maximum length is 21 cm. Fold-outs are not possible, but double-page layout may be considered. Originals should be prepared with attention to minimum size of lettering (2 mm) upon reduction. Originals, if not computer-generated, should be in ink or quality glossy photographs. Photocopies are generally unsatisfactory and are acceptable only for submission to reviewers. Mark all illustrations with author's name and figure number.

Submit computer-generated figures as JPEG, EPS, TIFF, or PICT format as appropriate, indicating the platform (Mac/PC) and program(s) used. Fonts should be kept to a minimum, and converted to paths whenever possible. Consult our production department for any clarification.

PHOTOGRAPHS AND HALFTONES. Originals, and photocopied reproductions for reviewers (indicating black/white or color), should be submitted with the manuscript, preferably at publication size (column and page dimensions as above). Include metric scale or scale bars in all illustrations, including, when possible, field and landscape photographs. Scale indicators within figures are always to be preferred, rather than magnification in the caption.

CAPTIONS. Captions for all illustrations should be listed together, typed double-spaced on a numbered page following the references.

COLOR ILLUSTRATIONS: Photographs and/or figures can be printed in color only if the authors defray the cost.

References

List alphabetically according to author those references cited in the text. List references by the same author in the following order: author alone, chronologically; author plus one co-author, alphabetically and then chronologically; author plus more than one co-author, chronologically only. List all authors (and editors). Make sure names, initials, titles, and pages are accurate. For books (including published proceedings of conferences), indicate publisher and city of publication. Titles in Hebrew or other languages should be translated, indicating in parentheses the original language and, if present, an English abstract. Journal titles should be quoted in full or abbreviated according to the *International List of Periodical Title Word Abbreviations*.

No editorial responsibility can be taken for the accuracy of the references; authors are requested to check these with special care.

Cover photo

Authors are encouraged to submit, along with their article, a related monochrome or color illustration which may be appropriate for the cover of the journal. If it is used, the author will receive covers on his 25 free reprints.

Short contributions.

Authors are encouraged to submit discussion papers, meeting summaries, notes, letters, and reviews of new books pertinent to the Near East. Where applicable, such material will be submitted for review in the usual manner.

Photographs

Photographs of interest to our readers are invited. Include a descriptive caption, typed double-spaced on a separate page. Include the location of the photograph and the name and affiliation of the photographer.

Proofs

Return proofs promptly. Check them carefully against the manuscript, paying particular attention to tables, equations, and references. Answer clearly all remaining questions indicated in the margins. Substantial changes in the original text which are requested at the proof stage may be billed to the author. Twenty-five reprints are supplied free of charge; additional reprints, as well as copies of the issue at a reduced rate, may be ordered when returning proofs. Return of original figures should be requested at this time, if it has not been done. Manuscripts and original materials will be discarded six months after publication.
